The Premier of Gauteng

Economic Growth

GDP of R290 billion in 1996 to **R1.5 trillion in 2017.**

The **Gauteng economy** is the **seventh largest economy** in Africa



Gauteng population grew from 7.8 million in 1996 to **14.7 million in 2018.** **One in every four people** who live in South Africa, **lives in Gauteng**



Number of people employed in the **Gauteng economy** increased from 4.7 million in 2014 to **5.1 million in 2018**



Access to basic services is much **higher** and **more inclusive.**

Formal dwelling is at **81%**; **piped water** is at **91%**; **electricity** is at **92%**; **sanitation** is at **91%** and **refuse removal** is at **83%**. These basic services were ranging between 50% and 65% in 1994

Gauteng has created **469 000 net new jobs** since 2014

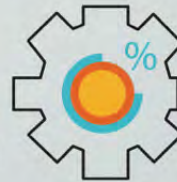

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Infrastructure Development

Gauteng government spent

R80 billion on **infrastructure development**

this includes industrial parks; upgrading and reconstruction of roads; public transport; schools; libraries; clinics and hospitals; rehabilitation centres between 2009 and 2018

Upgraded and **rehabilitated** the **road** network of more than **5000 km**

Gauteng has developed a **15-year Infrastructure Master Plan** for the development of new infrastructure worth **R1.3 Trillion**

Gauteng has rolled-out

broadband to more than **1 1181 sites**, including **schools, hospitals, public service customer care centres and industrial parks.**

Gauteng currently has over **10 000 km of fibre**

The **Gautrain** and **BRT systems**

in metros are just the beginning of the efficient public transport plan in Gauteng



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Good Governance and Clean Administration

For two consecutive years (2016/17 and 2017/18), all Gauteng departments and agencies obtained **unqualified audit reports**



Gauteng is the only province that got **100% unqualified audit** outcomes in the **2017/18 financial year**

The **number of clean audits** has increased from 56% in 2014 to **65% in 2018**

Measures put in place to ensure Good Governance

- Open Tender system
- The appointment of the civil society-led Ethics Advisory Council
- Collaboration with the Special Investigating Unit, Public Service Commission and the Public Protector in combating corruption and maladministration



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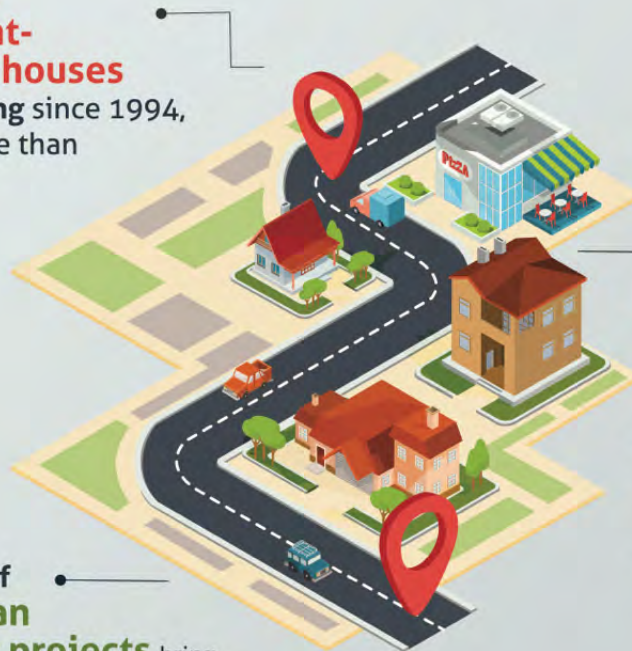

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Quality Education

335 new schools built,

more than **10 000 classrooms** refurbished, **1800 classrooms** converted into ICT-enabled classrooms, **1500 computer labs** and **83 new libraries** built across the province since 1994

Gauteng is consistently among the **top 3 best performing provinces** in Grade 6, 8 and 12 examinations and international assessments

Best performing province in Grade 12 results. Gauteng **Matric results** have improved from 61% in 2004 to **87,9% in 2018**

2.4 million learners in the public education system today, as opposed to **1.2 million learners in 1994**



483 000 children now have access to **Early Childhood Development**

1.2 million girl learners provided with **dignity packs**

R1 billion spent annually

on **student bursaries** - in line with the skills that are aligned to the priority sectors of Gauteng's economy

500 000 learners from poor households received **school uniforms**



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Youth Empowerment

514 000 young people benefited from the youth empowerment programme, Tshepo 500 000 launched in 2014

The private/public initiative provides young people with skills to access the labour market and access entrepreneurship opportunities

Tshepo 500 000 has since been upscaled to

Tshepo 1 Million

given the scale of youth unemployment and is linked to the opportunities in the township economy

Through the Welfare-to-Work intervention,

36 000 young mothers

have been transitioned out of the social grant system to employment and self-employment



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A Healthy Gauteng

20 million people use the **public health system** per annum, an increase from **7 million people** per annum in 2004



41 new community health centres and clinics and **7 new hospitals** have been built in the province since 1994

Average life expectancy of **Gauteng residents** is **64 years**, compared to 54.7 years for women and 52.2 years for men in 2006



Anti-retroviral therapy has drastically reduced mother-to-child HIV transmission in Gauteng to **0.68%**, which is close to the target of **0%**

281 out of 372 (75%) Ideal Clinics in South Africa are in Gauteng. They are **clean, open on time, well run, have reduced waiting times and high rates of medicine availability**



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Women and Girls

Women constitute the **largest number of beneficiaries** of Gauteng government programmes; **60%** beneficiaries of *Agri-enterprise* programme, **55%** of the *bursary programme*, **60%** of the *Tshepo 1 Million* and **65%** of the *houses* delivered

Gauteng Government spends **22% of its procurement budget** on **women owned businesses**, which is close to the 30% target set for 2019

7 000 women-owned co-operatives have received financial and non-financial support from agencies of the provincial government



Educating imbokodo, **57% of the 18 000 students** that have received bursaries from the GPG are female

257 women safety desks and **73 victim empowerment centres** across Gauteng have been established to support survivors of gender-based violence

Gauteng leads with the **highest number of women** at **Senior Management level (44.15%)**, higher than the national average of 42.15%



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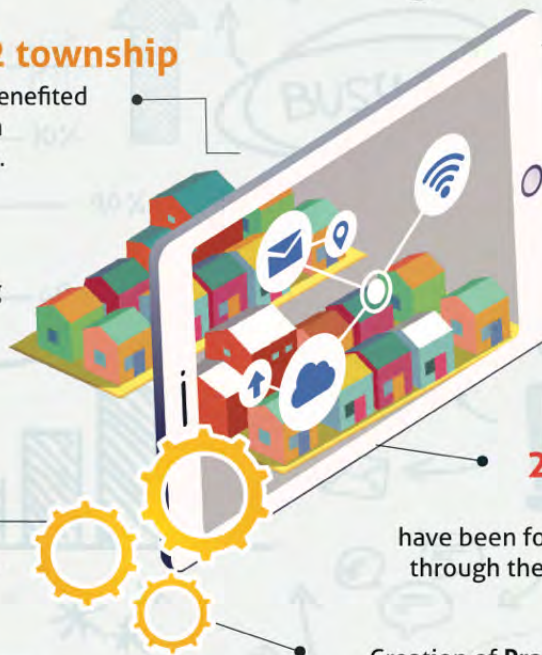
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Township Economy

Since 2014, over **7192 township businesses** have benefited from doing business with the Gauteng government.

GPG has spent over **R22 billion** procuring goods and services from township companies

Gauteng government has invested in **industrial infrastructure** through building and refurbishing
30 township industrial parks,
5 township Agri-Parks,
2 Township Automotive Hubs
and **7 eKasi Labs**



The Gauteng Provincial Government has rolled-out broadband infrastructure to more than **10 000 township Wi-fi hotspots**

20 000 township businesses have been formalised and supported through the **Qondi'sishishini Lakho programme**

Creation of **Provincial Small and Micro-Enterprise** Clearing house will take the Township Economic Revitalisation programme a step further

Hundreds of Entrepreneurs have benefited from the **Pitching Booster Programme**



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Sport, Arts and Culture

In 2016, **Gauteng won the school sports winter games**, and **won the national schools championship summer games** in 2018

Gauteng is Africa's creative pulse. **Gauteng accounts for 146 729 jobs** created in the creative and cultural sector

Gauteng attracts and hosts major creative industry events, including Book and Art Fairs, Music, Design, food and lifestyle festivals and Sport Tournaments

HALALA!! to the **Soweto Gospel Choir** and **Ladysmith Black Mambazo** for **winning Grammy Awards** this year.

More than **200 young athletes** from different schools in Gauteng represented South Africa in the **International Tri-Colour games** in July 2018 in **Italy**, and they **won gold** and **silver medals** for our nation
